Thank you for considering this renewal engagement with CapRisk Consulting Group (CapRisk) to continue providing actuarial services to Montague County (the County). #### 2. ACTUARIAL QUALIFICATIONS

Wilfred L. Thornthwaite, FSA, EA, MAAA, Consulting Actuary with more than 30 years professional experience is presented as lead consultant for this project. We will communicate with the County and its representatives during the project and go over any questions to ensure we properly reflect applicable information. Barring major changes, if a subsequent report revision is needed it will be delivered within a week after discussion.

#### 6. FEE SCHEDULE

Our fee includes the development of claims costs and other assumptions for the valuation as well as the preparation of the data files to be used in the valuation. This fee also includes the consultation to prepare the report and the actual preparation of the report. Based on our understanding of the plan<sup>1</sup>, the total cost for each GASB 75 valuation will not exceed \$4,950, with the initial valuation scheduled for reporting with the fiscal year ending September 30, 2020. Corresponding rollforward calculations if required for the "interim years" can be provided at <u>no additional cost</u>.
