PURPOSE

AGREEMENT

The parties agree as follows:

- 1. Sheriff's Office will:
 - Respond promptly to calls for service on District campuses.
 - Investigate criminal incidents occurring on school property.
 - Assist the District with emergency planning, drills, and critical incident response.
- 2. School District will:
- Notify the Sheriff's Office immediately of emergencies or criminal activity requiring law enforcement.
- Include the Sheriff's Office in safety drills and emergency planning.
- Provide access to facilities during emergencies and as required by law.
- 3. Both parties will:
 - Share information consistent with applicable laws, including FERPA.
 - Maintain open communication to support school safety.

This agreement shall begin on 12/01/2025 and continue unless amended or terminated in writing by either party.
